MYRRH-BEARERS



The Gospel reading today should be familiar to you. The Angel asks the Myrrh-bearing women to go tell the disciples (and Peter in particular) the news that they would meet the risen Lord in Galilee, but according to this Gospel the women do not do as commanded. Instead they flee from the tomb: "for trembling and astonishment had come upon them, and they said nothing to anyone for they were afraid"

What they witnessed was a theophany, a revelation of God.

It is so with us. When we first catch a glimpse of the glory of God we are not often ready to respond as we should.

Often in Holy Scripture we read that people fall on their faces in fear when an angel appears. The message nearly always is "do not be afraid".

We greet each other during the next forty days with our Paschal greeting:

Christ is Risen ! (English) Indeed He is Risen!

Christos Voskrese! (Slavonic) Voistinnu Voskrese!

Christos Anesti! (Greek) Alithos Anesti!
