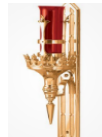

SUNDAY OF ZACCHAEUS



Today, we come to the Sunday of Zacchaeus, the last of the Sundays after Pentecost, and the opening to the new season of repentance and renewal. The goal of this journey is to help us move from the *periphery* of life where we are often immersed and to come closer to the *center*, that is, to Christ who is the Truth and Life.

Zacchaeus is a rich man, a tax collector, a Jew hired by the Roman authorities to collect taxes from his fellow countrymen. He did not realize that he was much of a sinner until he met Jesus. Then his life changed, dramatically!

Jesus said: "I must stay at your house tonight."

When we allow the Lord to come this close to us personally, something happens. We can change, much like Zacchaeus.
