You will receive a formal invitation and if you decide not to attend you will still receive a formal certificate recognizing the anniversary.

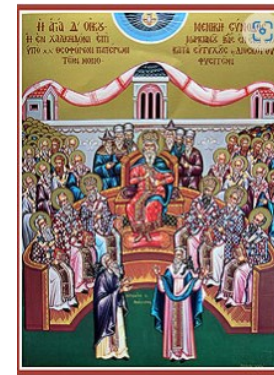
FATHERS OF THE SIX ECUMENICAL COUNCILS

ELIJAH - GREAT PROPHET

Elijah, Greek form: Elias was, according to the Book of Kings in the Hebrew Bible, a prophet and a miracle worker who lived in the northern Kingdom of Israel.(In the 9th century.) Elijah defended the worship of the Hebrew God over that of the Canaanite deity Baal. God also performed many miracles through Elijah, including resurrection, bringing fire down from the sky, and entering heaven alive “by fire”.

Since most Eastern Churches either use Greek as their liturgical language or translated liturgies from the Greek, Elias is the form of the prophet’s name used among most members of the Eastern Orthodox Church and those Eastern Catholic Churches which follow the Byzantine Rite.

As the icon of Elijah portrays, it is believed that he did not die but rode his fiery chariot to heaven.



The Church venerates the Holy Fathers of the Ecumenical Councils because Christ has established them as “lights upon the earth,” guiding us to the true Faith. “Adorned with the robe of truth,” the doctrine of the Fathers, based upon the preaching of the Apostles, has established one faith for the Church. The Ecumenical Councils, are the highest authority in the Church. Such Councils, guided by the grace of the Holy Spirit, and accepted by the Church, are infallible.
